Mrs. Mabel Patton spent Thanksgiving with her son's family, the Vern Pattons at Lacombe.

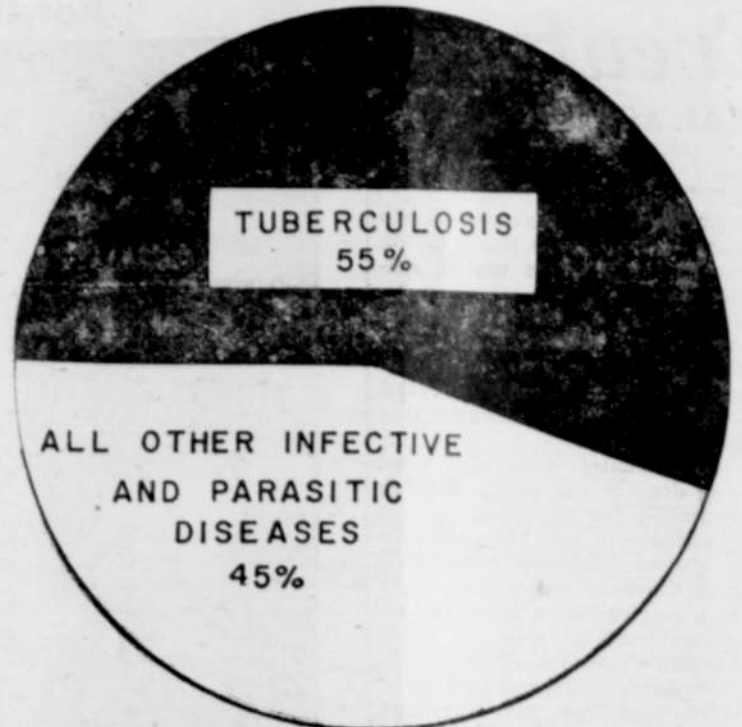
Mr. and Mrs. Jack Ryland were guests Thanksgiving day at the Frank Meisner home in Springfield. The Meisners were former residents here.
