Spelling Hints Given
Students by OSC Expert

Good spellers are made, not born, and they're made mostly from desire, correct pronunciation, and knowing the meaning of words to be spelled, according to an Oregon State college professor who is author of a new spelling book for high school students. Ned D. Marksheffel, assistant professor of education, says spelling is "sold short" by too many students, who fail to realize that spelling is basic to writing and that it is an extremely important subject. Many factors are involved in spelling—intelligence, ability to read, background experience, etc.—but the average student can learn to be a good speller if he wants to and if he works at it. His method for studying spelling includes these steps: know the meaning of the word; be able to pronounce it correctly; break the word down into syllables; say it aloud; and then write it. Special emphasis is placed on knowing the meaning of words to be spelled. "Learning to spell words which have no meaning may be a fine form of mental gymnastics, but it is not conducive to spelling growth," he says. Here are some other suggestions: Always learn to pronounce the word clearly and distinctly. Research by spelling experts has shown that a person needs to know how to pronounce a word before he can spell it correctly. Library and government, for example, are often misspelled because they're mispronounced "library" and "government." Review is important. Within 24 hours from the time you learn new words, have someone test you on them again, he advises students. The dictionary is a great help in "studying" words, Marksheffel points out. It helps not only with definitions but also with pronunciation and with breaking the word down into syllables.
