Junior Olympics Held at Gates

Mari-Linn school descended "en-mass" on the Gates Oval for the annual Junior Olympics Track-Field Meet, May 29th to take the meet by scoring 144 points. Gates, host for the event scored 82 points and Mill City 53. Only elementary schools were included this year with participants in three age groups, midges, 10 and 11 years of age; juniors, 12 and 13 years; and intermediate, 14 and 15 years.

Ann Powell of Mari-Linn and Jack Frost of Gates were tripple winners and each were on winning relay teams in the intermediate division. Miss Powell was a winner in the state meet held in Portland last year. Frost scored a creditable 61.2 in the 440 yard run, a pretty good time for a fourteen year old. Double winners were Karren Marshall of Mill City, Barbara Nydegger of Mari-Linn and Dennis Christensen of Gates all in the Junior division.

Mari-Linn scored 18 firsts, Gates 10 and Mill City 4. Powell and Frost each scored 16 1/2 points to lead all fields.

This meet has been an annual affair for the past three years having been instigated by G. B. Frost in his first year as Superintendent-Principal of the Gates School District.
