er company, and the Snake river area.

In cooperation with the ODC, the remaining 10 areas have launched studies to show the extent of raw materials supplies immediately available to a mill site, likely mill sites in each area and figures to aid in the determination of the most economic size and type of mill adapted to the area, giving special attention to effluent disposal.

This information then will be compiled in reports to be made available to firms, individuals and groups most interested.

"A number of companies in the specific fields of wood composition board and pulp and paper manufacturing already have indicated their desire to receive these reports," Smith declared. "The ODC has considerable basis for believing that some tangible economic benefits can arise within the very near future."

Morgan & Young Get Pamela Creek Contract

Of the total estimated amount above 7,500,000 is Douglas Fir, 400,000 Cedar, and 1,000,000 board feet Hemlock and other species.
