

"We need exhibitors from every county and especially from eastern and southern Oregon," Mr. Travis said. "We want the people of the state to feel that this is their fair and we want it truly representative." Whether exhibitors are thinking of entering a sewing or weaving exhibit, a bouquet of flowers or some dairy cattle, the first thing to do is to send for a premium book. They may be secured from the state fair in Salem, or at any county agent's office. The premium book lists thirteen departments in which exhibits can be entered, including dairy cattle, dual purpose cattle, beef cattle draft horses, sheep and goats, swine, poultry, pigeons and rabbits, honey bee, land products, including fruits and grain, floral and garden, art, foods, and textiles.

The exhibitor, whether amateur or least you can do is call us. commercial, is urged to story commercial, is urged to study carevision. In some departments there is a small entry fee. Others regire no fee. Entry blanks can be secured without charge from the state fair. Exhibitors in the Textile Department must be Oregon residents. The last day for filing entries varies with different departments but is is about the middle of August, Exhibitors who win prizes are given ribbons and cash awards which vary from fifty cents to \$200. All exhibits will be returned to the owner at the end of the fair.
