
New Microscope Aids OSC Research

KEEP OREGON GREEN With a continued increase in Oregon's population, mostly comprised of newcomers who know little of the forest fire hazard and problem, and with a heavy growth of underbrush as well as slashing on the ground that is now fast drying out, the forest fire danger this year is now with

Thousands of people will go to the forest areas to spend summer weekends. The Keep Oregon Green Association addresses a special appeal to the hundreds of tousands of Oregon residents to acquaint themselves with the urgent need of great prudence. A trip along the Wilson River Highway, through the great Tillamook Burn, or up the Santiam Highway to Detroit Dam would serve as an unforgetable object lesson.

Dean Walter McCulloch is Chairman of the Keep Oregon Green organization. In a recent statement, Dean McCulloch deminded Oregonians that each of them has a stake in our forests. "The forests supply us with our largest payroll," he said, "with recreational areas unsurpassed in the nation, with a watershed cover for our rivers and streams, with homes for wildlife. Protection of these great natural resources by fire now becomes a civic responsibility of the highest order."

Motor Vehicle Travel Shows Decline This Year

A 11/2 percent drop in Oregon motor vehicle travel so far this year was reported today by the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission.

Latest month to show a drop was April when travel fell off about 12, 000,000 miles from that recorded for April a year ago. So far this year, January has been the only month to show an increase in total motor vehicle mileage.

The rather low travel figure for April of 589,990,150 miles was matched by a drop in traffic deaths with 31 reported for that month. The state's death rate was 5.3 persons n each 100 million miles of travel. This compares with a 6.5
