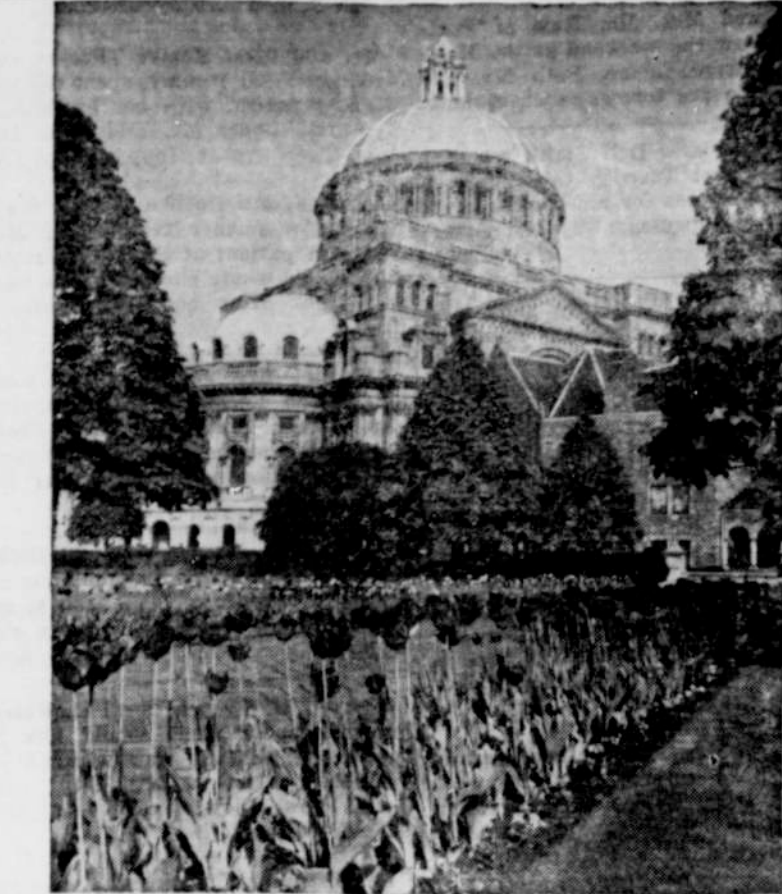

When freezing individual servings of meat, separate with squares of transparent plastic film before overwrapping. Makes it easy to separate.

If your double boiler keeps boiling all the water away, put a metal jar cap in the bottom. It will rattle when the water is low and serve as a signal to add more water.

To give drip and dry garments a fair chance, it's important to lift them from the water without wringing or squeezing so the weight of the water will pull out the wrinkles.

Blanch asparagus 2 to 4 minutes for freezing, depending on size of stalk. Cool quickly, drain and pack.

Phyllis Pate has been elected the Bean Festival Princess from Santiam. We know that she will represent us well.

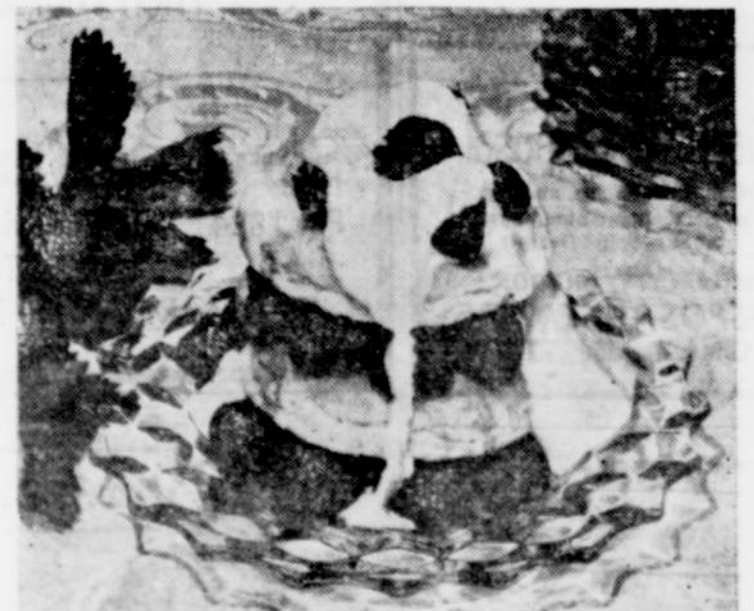

It's Strawberry Shortcake Week



If you've been looking for an excuse to enjoy all the luscious strawberry shortcake you can hold, this is it! The Oregon State Strawberry Council, Oregon Wheat Commission and Oregon Dairy Products Commission have banded together to make June 3-10 Strawberry Shortcake Week.

For a shortcake you'll be proud to serve your family and guests, be sure to select large, juicy Oregon strawberries. Wash, drain and hull them, saving the prettiest ones for decoration. Put the rest of the berries in a bowl, sprinkle with sugar and cut through several times with a knife to insure even sweetening. About 1/2 cup of sugar to each pint box of berries should be sufficient.

About two tablespoons of sugar to one cup of cream will be enough for whipped cream sweetening. 1/4 teaspoon of vanilla and 1/8 teaspoon of salt will give added flavor.

When our crispy butter biscuits

(see recipe below) are done, layer with berries, top generously with sweetened whipped cream, garnish with the whole berries you set aside—and enjoy a real Strawberry Shortcake Week treat!

Crispy Butter Biscuit

2 cups sifted enriched all-purpose flour; 4 teaspoons baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar; 2 tablespoons sugar; 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1/2 cup shortening; 2-3 cup milk 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, 2 tablespoons melted butter.

Sift together flour, baking powder, cream of tartar, sugar, cinnamon and salt. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles small peas. Add milk and vanilla all at once. Stir until dough follows fork around bowl.

Pat or roll dough 1/4 inch thick. Brush with melted butter. Cut into rounds. Place on baking sheet, buttered side down. Brush tops with remaining butter. Bake at 425° F 8 to 10 minutes. Makes 8 4-inch biscuits.
