Cascade Music Retreat Being Held at Santiam Lodge; To Give Concert

LYONS—The children attending the Cascade Music Retreat Music camp will leave Mari-Linn school at Lyons on August 11 at 10 a. m. Those not wishing transportation furnished may go directly to the Santiam Lodge at Santiam Pass. Children should take sleeping bags, clothing suitable for warm days and cool nights, toilet articles, bathing suit, insect repellent, and musical instruments. All food will be furnished except for a sack lunch for noon Monday the 11th. Friday evening, the 15th, the group will give a concert at Suttle Lake. Parents are invited to eat supper with the children at 5 o'clock on this evening. Parents wishing to remain overnight may do so for a small charge if they bring sleeping bags. Those wishing to attend the concert on this evening should notify James Wright before August 5. Children will be properly supervised during their stay at camp. Parents wish to pick up the children at camp Saturday may do so, or they may be picked up at Mari-Linn school Saturday the 16th at 11:30. If there is no musical instrument for your child, contact James Wright soon so they may provide an instrument. The children are insured and a doctor will be provided in case of an emergency. Speed Listed As No. 1 Killer on Highways

Speed—the No. 1 driving error—continues to be the principal killer in Oregon, an analysis of the 20 fatal traffic accidents in May reveals.

In eight fatal accidents, or 40 per cent, in May, which killed eight and injured seven, speed was traced as the primary cause.

Primary causes among the other 12 fatal accidents were improper passing, two; failure to yield right of way, improper turning, asleep or incapacitated, and failure to heed a railroad crossing sign, one each. The cause of three others were listed as "unknown."

The three pedestrian fatalities analyzed showed one death as a result of attempting to hitch a ride on a moving vehicle, one from walking with traffic alongside the road, and in the other an intoxicated person was struck at an intersection at night by a car without its lights on.

The breakdown also shows that alcohol was involved in at least four fatal accidents.
