### Oregon Highway Traffic Increases 9.7% Over Last Oct. Says Report

Oregon highway traffic increased 9.7 per cent during October 1958, compared to October 1957, according to the State Highway Department's monthly count recorded at 63 locations throughout the state.

October was the first month to show an increase over 1957 since May, when the count was 1 per cent greater than May of 1957, and the only substantial increase since January.

For the first 10 months of the year, 1958 remained ahead of 1957 by 0.7

per cent with urban traffic up 2.9 per cent for the same period.

The increase in traffic during October was partly due to the opening of the deer season. Maximum daily traffic occurred at most rural locations on October 3rd, the day prior to the opening of the season.

While the beach routes indicated a seasonal decline, the over-all traffic trend along 101 showed an increase over the same period in 1957 with Winchester Bay reporting an increase of 8 per cent.

Department figures also revealed that Oregon gasoline consumption increased 4.21 per cent during September 1958, as compared to September 1957. For the first 9 months of the year, gasoline consumption was up 0.59 per cent.

### Compensation Com. Less Unemployment Than Last Year Says

Oregon's winter, back to normal after an unusual rainless start, has given the Unemployment Compensation Commission its first true picture of the off-season employment pattern. November compilations reflect a still receded economy, but one considerably improved over a year ago.

Estimates from State Employment Service offices across Oregon tally 44,100 unemployed on December 1, compared to 50,600 last year at this time. Non-farm employment levels, notably in trade and manufacturing, are apparently on the return climb after severe drops a year ago.

Employment Service placement activities showed their annual seasonal decrease when compared to last month. But here too there is considerable increase over last year.

Non-agricultural placements totaled 3,370 this November. Though this was just slightly above November, 1957, it gains significance when recalling that placement activities occupied fewer working days this November—a month of many holidays, in considering the day-to-day average, for example, this November's placements show a 15.1 per cent increase over a year ago. Most notable gains were in the construction, lumber, and trade industries, which grew by 33.3, to 50.0 and 47.1 per cent respectively.

Agricultural placements dropped to 2,357 during November, down 88 per cent from October. The decrease is normal at the end of Fall harvests and various other farm activities.
