Announced as winner of the Ethel Hickey award, a memorial set up in honor of the well-loved high school principal from 1926 to 1938, was Judith Ann Hoeye, one of the 39 graduates for 1959. This consists of \$15 in books of the winner's choice. This award was started by a group of Miss Hickey's former students a number of years ago, and goes to the student judged by the faculty and the alumni committee as the most outstanding of the entire student body in scholarship, achievement, loyalty, and cooperation.

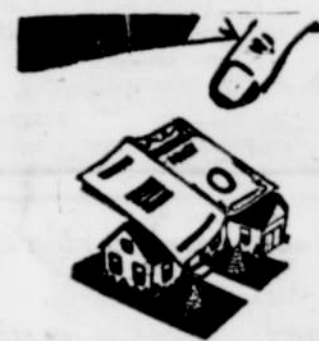
