Fair Patrons to Get Bargain at Matinee Shows

Bargain matinee of the Bob Crosby show will be presented the first four days of the Oregon State Fair in Salem, Sept. 5-12, manager Howard Maple announced Wednesday. The performances at 6:30 p. m. on Sept. 5, 7 and 8 will feature box seat and ringside prices of \$1.75, and all other seats will cost only \$1 for adults and 50 cents for children through the age of 16. The reduced prices will also be in effect for the 2:30 p. m. performance on Sept. 6.

There will be 8:45 p. m. performances on Sept. 5, 7 and 8, and 8 p. m. performances on the other five days. Then ticket prices will be \$2.25 for box and ringside seats, and \$1.75 and \$1 for reserved seats. An all-star show, headed by Crosby and Lucille Norman, will be presented. Both stars have just returned from triumphant appearances at the London Palladium.

It is difficult to find two more versatile stars, Crosby, who first gained fame with his Bobcats, a top Dixieland group, has appeared in movies, on stage and was a morning television fixture for many years.

Miss Norman ranks at the top of the versatile singers. She has sung everything from blues to operatic arias in a single evening. She won her first singing contest at the age of 13, and a year later was guest soloist with the Denver Symphony Orchestra.

Crosby will be master of ceremonies, both will sing solos and then the two will join together for a medley of songs.

Five other acts will be presented in the 90 minute extravaganza, including performing dogs, a torch act, comedy in song and dance and eight pretty dancers.

Dwight Moore's Mongrel Revue, the most intelligent canine stars in the country, have been brought back for a repeat performance after tickling the fancy of last year's audiences.

Renee and Hall present comedy in song and dance, and the Whipperwills give their rendition of popular songs. Sons of Morocco provide a spectacular flaming torch act on a slack wire.

The eight pretty dancers are the Claydettes, and they have perfected precision dancing, besides being pleasing to look at.

Silverton Man to Oppose Neuberger

R. F. Cook, Silverton farmer, announced Wednesday that he is now a candidate for the Republican nomination for the United States Senate. This is for the seat now held by Senator Richard L. Neuberger.

Mr. Cook gave as his reason for seeking this office: "To make sure there is a true conservative on the ticket."

He added: "The announcement is made now in order to give more time to present the facts at issue to the people of Oregon. A thorough and economical campaign cannot be conducted in sixty days."
