Be Sure and Report Earnings of All Employees Says Social Security Man

Most people today know that when they retire social security payments will help to replace their lost wages. What many people do not seem to know is that the benefits they receive will be based on the record of earnings maintained for them by the Social Security administration, says Ormond Gildow, representative of the Salem district office. It is, therefore, extremely important that all of one's earnings be credited to his account.

The reports on which the social security administration bases its records are those made by an individual's employers. While most employers are careful to see that their reports are accurate and timely, Gildow points out that some employers are not aware of the need for or the importance of properly reporting the wages of their employees.

This is quite frequently the case among private individuals who employ help in their homes, Gildow said. He suggests that those who work for private employers make sure that they show their social security card to their employers when they first start to work, so that he can copy the name and number exactly as it appears on the card. This will insure that the employer has the necessary information to make his reports.

Every employee should request a statement of his earnings record from social security office every three years. If some earnings are not recorded, the social security office can then assist in getting the record corrected.

If every worker will follow these two steps, he can be sure that his social security benefit will be the full amount that his earnings will entitle him to receive.

Tips For Protecting Deer Carcass Listed

Oregon deer and elk hunters can keep magpies and other scavengers away from their kill simply by hanging strips of tissue from the carcass.

The slightest breeze rustles the lightweight tissue and scares birds and animals away. This trick is good when the carcass hangs in the open no more than one day, for the scavengers soon gather courage to attack the hanging carcass.

Dragging entrails and other waste 25 to 50 feet away from the hanging carcass attracts the scavengers to the waste and leaves good meat for the hunter.

The Oregon Motor Court Ass'n. statewide organization of motel operators unveiled a new tourist promotion project today—"Travel Seals"—which they hope will help to give the state its biggest tourist year of all in 1960.
