Common Moles Can Be Controlled

The common mole can be controlled whenever it is active. Moles have been quite active this fall with the drier soil conditions which have prevailed.

The 'scissor-jaw' type trap rates high in mole control, according to Marion County Extension Agent Wilbur L. Bluhm. The largest sizes of this trap seems to be most effective.

Several techniques in setting the scissor-jaw trap must be used for good results. After the main runway is found—on a line between two mounds or at the mound—dig a hole down to it for the trap to sit in. Fit the trap in position squarely straddling the runway. Be sure no part of the trap is in the runway.

Next, pack the soil firmly under the trigger so the mole must work through it and "spring" the trap. After the trap is set, fill the hole and cover the trap with loose soil to exclude all light.

While the scissor-jaw trap is usually most effective, vegetable and grain baits treated with thallium sulfate have been successful in some areas. These ready-to-use baits, as well as the traps, are available at hardware, farm and garden supply stores.

When setting traps or placing baits, the deeper runways should be used. The shallow surface runways, where the mole pushes up the soil, are seldom used more than once.
