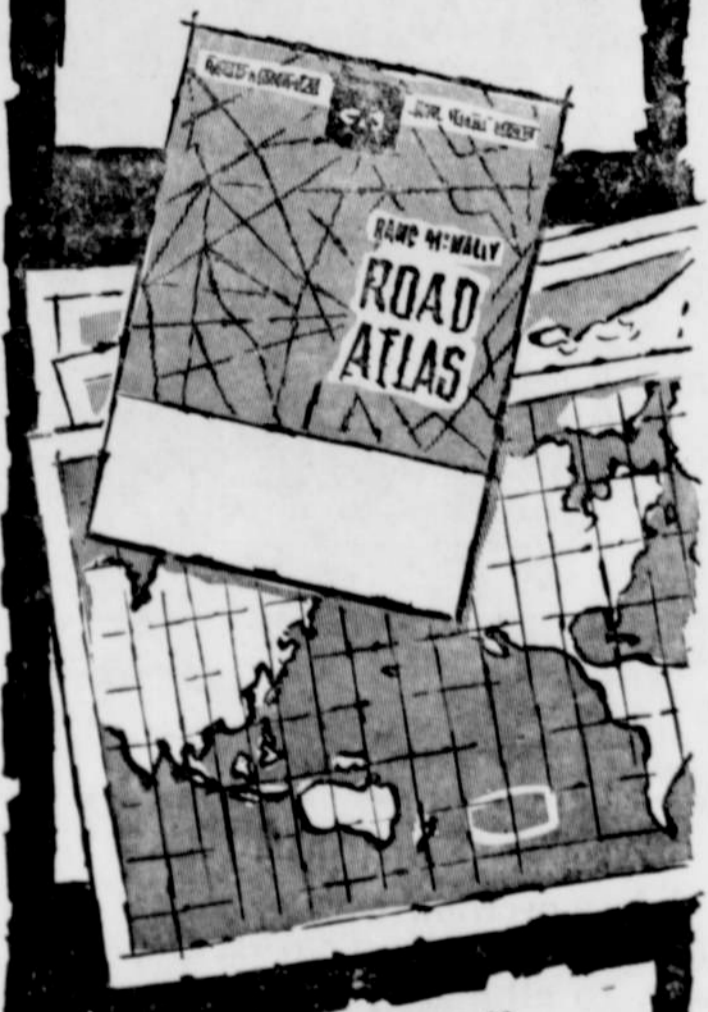

She passed away Saturday evening at their home.

Elizabeth Quinn was born January 19, 1888 at London, Ontario, Canada, and came to Mill City when just 18 months old in the summer of 1889 and was a pioneer resident of this area.

She married R. L. Faust June 16, 1909 in Mill City and lived most of her married life here.

The Fausts were owners of the former Hammond Lumber Company store for many years and later the Faust & Ross grocery.

Mrs. Faust was a graduate of Willamette University, majoring in music. She was a charter member of the Mill City Presbyterian church and remained active in church work until her illness. She was also a long-time member of the Mill City Woman's club.

Survivors include her husband, R. L. Faust, daughters, Mrs. Edna Ross of Mill City; Mrs. Mary Belle Trask, Albany; Mrs. Nancy Jane Thacker, Dinsmore, Calif., and Mrs. Erah Vai Parks, Riddle, a son, Robert M. Faust of Oregon City and nine grandchildren.

Final services were held at Fairview cemetery with the Rev. Richard Cole of the Presbyterian church officiating.
