Potatoes keep best in a dry, dark, ventilated place. About 45 to 50 degrees. Potatoes shrivel and sprout in a warm place. The starch turns to sugar if potatoes are stored in a cold place. Store these potatoes at room temperature for a week or two to change the sugar back to starch.

Roast turkey at 300 to 324 degrees. The inside of the bird stays at room temperature if roasted below 300 degrees. Food poisoning could result.

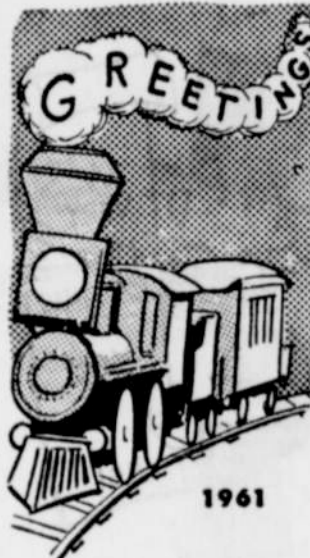
