Here's a Look At Your Foods Of the Future

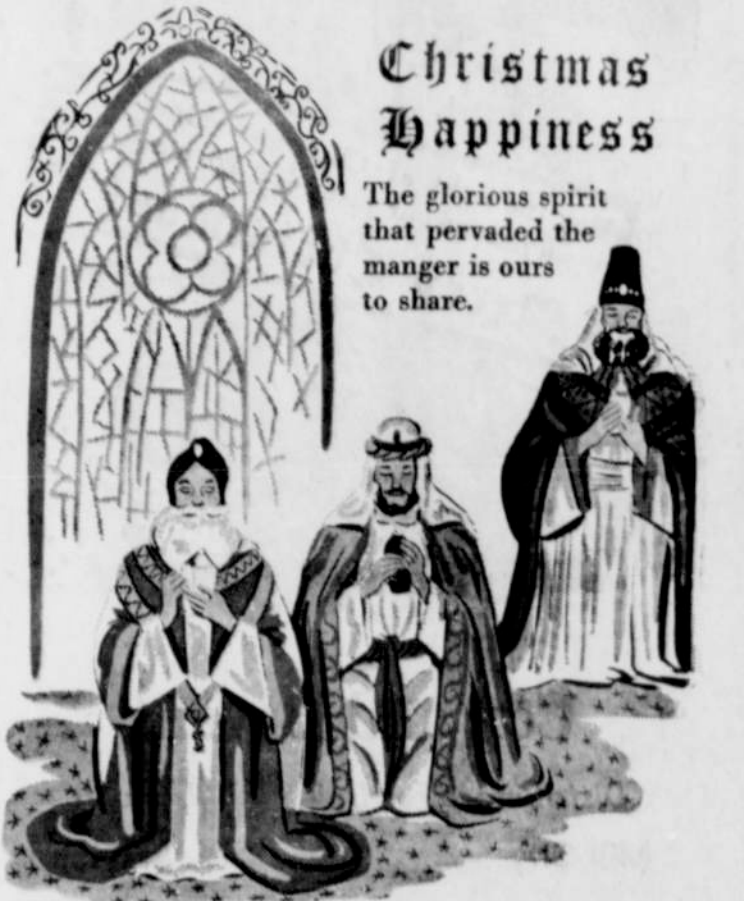
In just a few years, shoppers will be able to buy dried whole milk, instant powdered fruit drinks with built-in carbonators, and more tender, ready-to-eat meat and poultry products.
Strides made in food processing, preservation and packaging over the last 20 years are only a harbinger of what's ahead, believes Dr. H. W. Schultz, head of the Oregon State University food and dairy technology department.
Although there has been no appreciable increase in number of basic foodstuffs, more than 6,000 food items are now available in supermarkets—four times the number available 20 years ago. Already in the development stage, Dr. Schultz continues, are half of the food products expected to be in supermarkets by 1970.
What are some of these foods of the future?
Bread and other baked goods should undergo flavor and texture studies resulting in commercial products that resemble homemade favorites. Cake mixes will enjoy continued popularity with introduction of many new flavors and kinds.
Red meats—including both beef and pork—will be tenderized by injection of enzymes at slaughter guaranteeing tender, flavorful steaks and chops. Freeze-dried, precooked fresh and cured meats could become popular, says Dr. Schultz, if costs of freeze-drying can be reduced.
Scientists are at work to improve butter spreadability and flavor. Cheese lovers can look forward to consistently superior aged cheese in the future. Dried cottage cheese, that can be stored on the cupboard shelf, is also a possible newcomer, says Schultz.
More ready-to-eat meats will make it possible to serve fresh tasting seafoods thousands of miles inland any day of the week. Freeze-dried shrimp are already on the market.
Sweet potatoes and yams dress up holiday meals. Sweet potatoes are dry, mealy, and rather light yellow in color. Yams are deeper yellow, moist, and sugary.

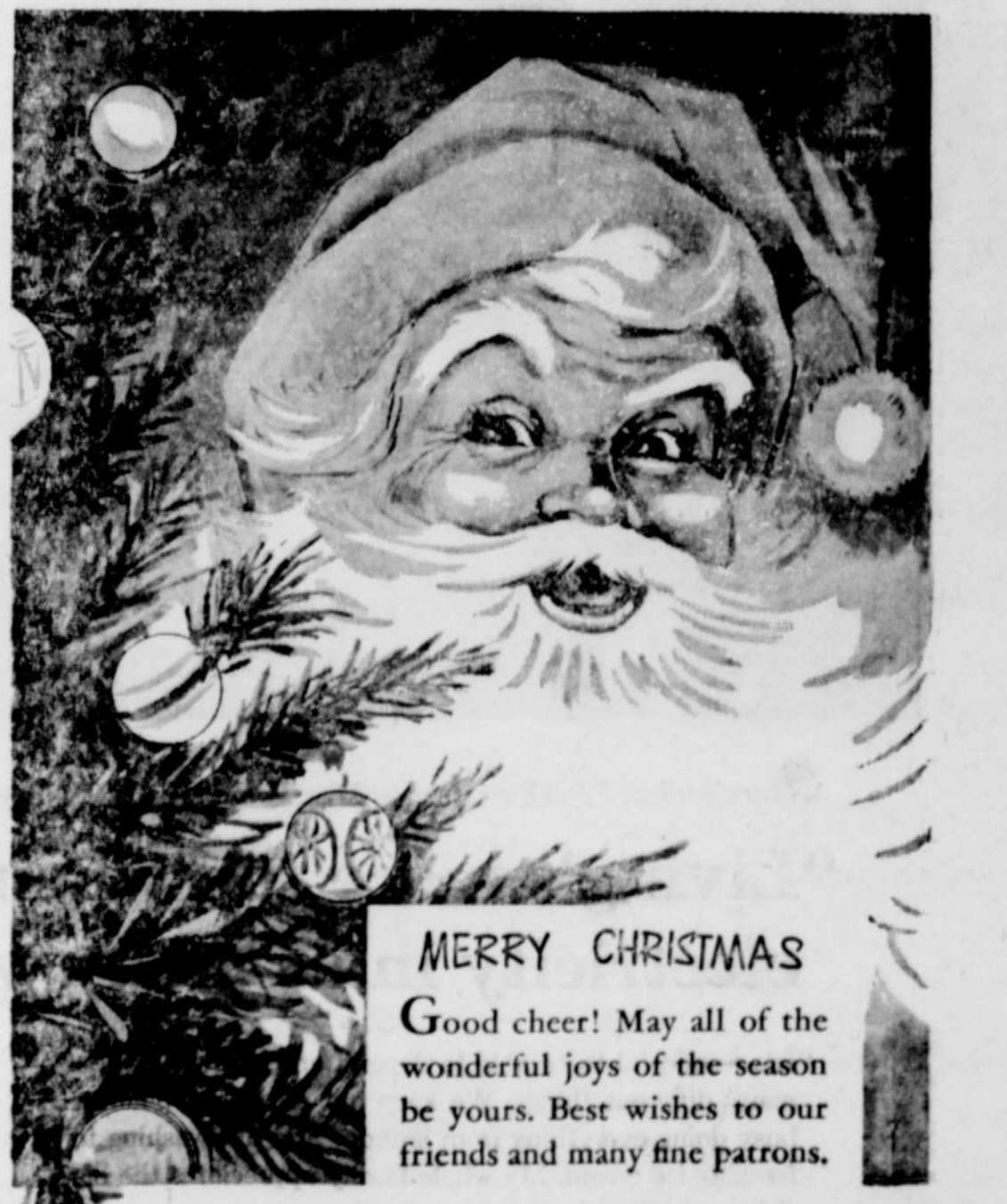
