### Homemaking Hints

**Home Economics**  
County Extension Agent

June Features Dairy Month  
—If you don't like milk, Cheese and ice cream may replace milk in your daily diet. You can substitute a one-inch cube of cheddar cheese for 2-3 cup milk; one-half cup cottage cheese for 1/2 cup milk; or one-half cup ice cream for 1/4 cup of milk. Ice Cream Costs Less—Ice cream is a real bargain. Retail prices of half-gallons of ice cream have dropped in the past ten years while other foods costs went up to 8%, according to the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture. Milk-A-Low-cal drink. If you're watching your weight, milk can be your ally for its ofers out-standing food values at reasonably calorie rates. Right now milk production is seasonally high, according to the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture. A glass of whole milk is only 165 calories, while skim and butter milk add up to only 90 calories a glass.

**Money For A Longer Life**—People are living longer these days than ever before—yet many are not making financial plans which will help them enjoy their later life, point out Mrs. Dorothy Miller, O. S. U. Family Finance Specialist.

Planning for retirement in an orderly and systematic way during peak earning years can put an independent retirement within reach of almost everyone.

"Perhaps one reason so many of our retired people do not now have adequate funds, says Mrs. Miller, is that they never really focused attention on the sizeable amount of money that would require during later years."

People who reach 65 years of age can expect to live on another 15 years or so. How much money will a person need for those years? If spending each month after retirement is \$200 the total will run up to \$360,000. At \$300 a month the total will be \$54,000.

Most of us can count on some source of retirement income—Social Security, Employment Benefit Plans, annuities, etc. The wise person will find out just how much he can expect from these sources each month. Then figure out the total additional money required to reach a monthly income goal.

It's important to start as soon as you can to put away as much as you can for retirement purposes. Simple arithmetic shows why. A man of 40 has 25 years to accumulate the capital he'll need to retire at age 65; the man who is 50 has only 15 years in which to reach this financial goal.

**Ants In Your Pantry?**—When warm weather comes, the ants may come too.

USDA workers recommend all-base sprays for effective ant control at home. These sprays can be bought at hardware, drug or department stores under several trade names.

To be sure you get an effective one, check the label. The spray should contain one of the following insecticides: 2% chlordane, 0.5 percent aiedrine, 0.5% heptachlor.

Spray where you see ants crawling but do not contaminate food or dishes. Try to trace ants back to where they entered the house. Then spray the outside walls from the grounds up to the windows. Also spray lower part of window frames and around doors.

Take precautions with an oil spray because it is flammable and don't use near an open flame. Don't use an asphalt tile or linoleum. It will dissolve tiling. It will also injure grass, trees and shrubs. Be sure to read the directions on the label.
