Gifts Asked for Patients in Oregon Mental Hospitals

An appeal for Christmas gifts for the 4,000 patients in Oregon mental hospitals this year was emphasized by a letter from Gov. Mark O. Hatfield to Mental Health Association of Oregon president Joseph D. Matrazzo. The Governors's letter says:

"The Mental Health association of Oregon is sponsoring a project this year that emphasizes the positive side of mental illness—recovery. I would hope that citizens in all walks of life will support the Christmas gift project—which is only one of many through which the Association augments the efforts of our State and local agencies to assure that patients in our several institutions are made to feel a part of the community and are encouraged to lead useful lives.

"This year the association is urging that Oregonians give gifts of a vocational and rehabilitation nature . . . underlining the fact that new medications and early treatment give hope that many of those now hospitalized will be home next Christmas."

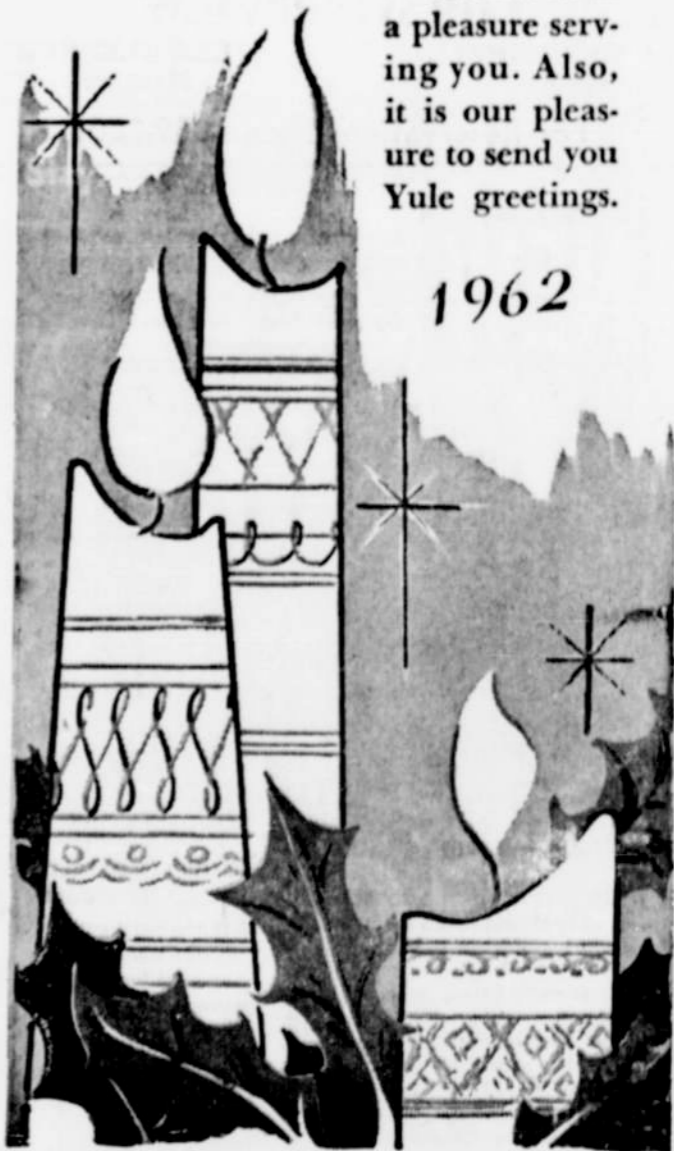
