The Mehama Fire department answered a call to a brush fire Saturday afternoon at the Jim Owens place above town. This was the first fire for the new fire truck, purchased recently.

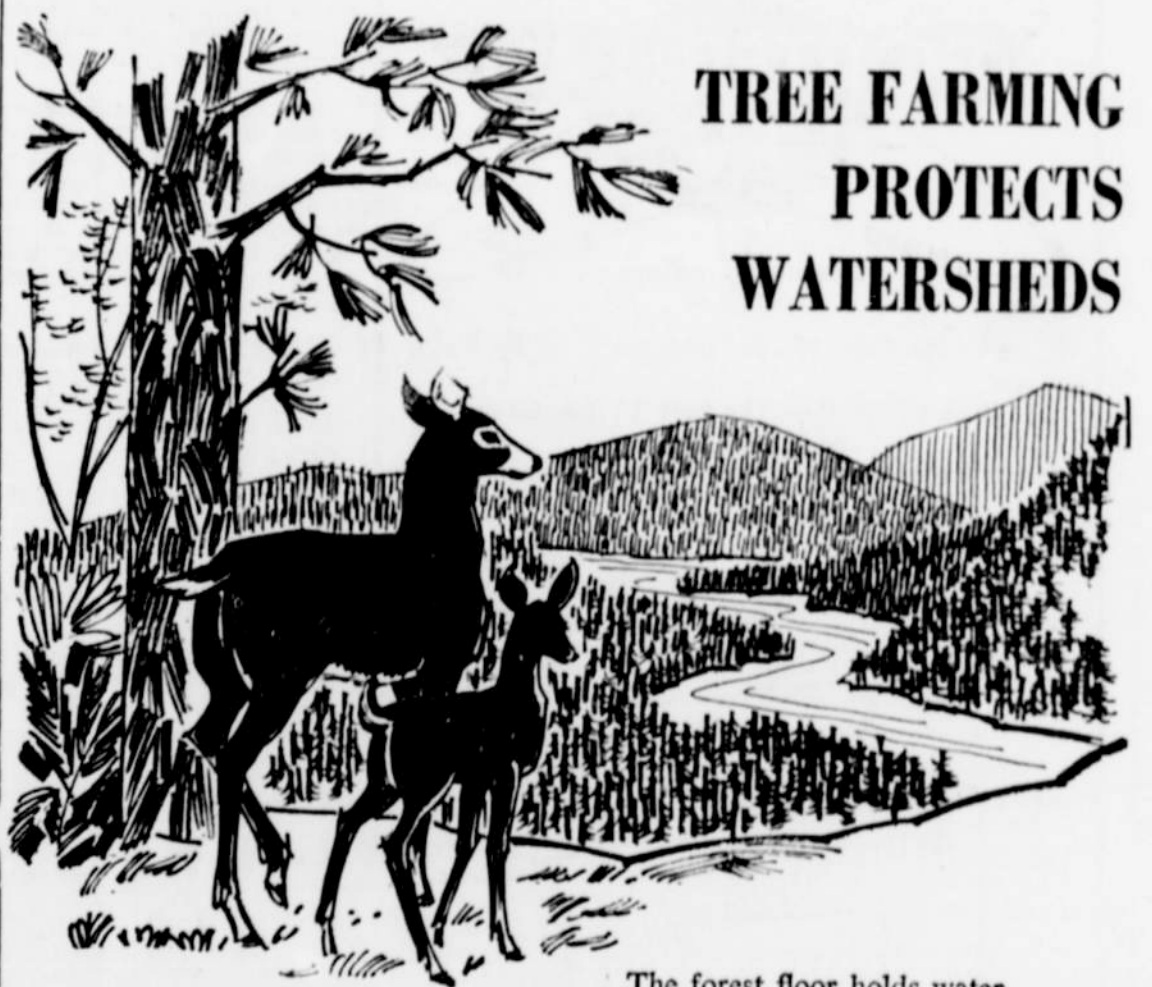
