Sealed proposals for the construction of a concrete reservoir, chlorine building, and water transmission line, addressed to the Mayor and City Council, Detroit, Oregon, will be received at the office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Detroit, Oregon, until 7:30 p. m. Pacific Daylight Time, on the 2nd day of July, 1963, and then will be publicly opened and read.

The work contemplated consists of the construction of a 50,000-gallon concrete reservoir, a concrete block chlorinator building complete with chlorinator and appurtenances, and approximately 1200 linear feet of 4-inch welded steel water transmission pipeline.

Plans and Specifications may be examined in the office of Robert P. Gorman, Civil Engineer, Bell Building, P. O. Box 593, Stayton, Oregon. A copy of said Documents may be obtained at the Engineer's office on request upon a deposit of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) for each Document. The full amount of the deposit will be refunded if said Documents are returned in good condition within Fifteen (15) days after the award of the Contract.

Bidders must be prequalified in accordance with the laws of Oregon.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond payable to the City of Detroit, Oregon, in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the amount bid.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish a bond for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the Contract price.
