Innovations To Mark Mary's Peak Trek

Big preparations are under way for the 18th annual Mary's Peak Trek—the world's largest picnic—this year marked by three innovations.

Major innovation on the 1962 event, dated for Sunday, August 18, is the location. For the first time, it will be held at Avery Park in Corvallis, rather than on Mary's Peak, nearly 30 miles from Corvallis.

Another will be the presentation of the Wenatchee Youth Circus at Parker Stadium, a 90-year-old organization that enthralled big crowds during Portland's 1963 Rose Festival, and chosen by the Saturday Evening Post as the nation's outstanding youth group.

The third will be an antique automobile show, scheduled at Avery Park.
