Your Social Security

Q. Can I file my application for social security benefits before I actually retire?

A. Yes, you can file three months prior to actual retirement. In fact, the social security office recommends that the application be filed at least several weeks before retirement, so that there will be less chance of a delay in receiving benefit checks.

Q. What papers should I bring when I come to the social security office to file?

A. You should bring your social security card, proof of age, your Withholding Statement, Form W-2, for 1962, and a record of your earnings to date in 1963. If you were self-employed in 1962, you should bring your Federal income tax return for that year. However, do not delay your visit because you do not have all of these items.

Q. Can I get an estimate of what my social security retirement benefits would be before I actually retire?

A. If you give the social security district office sufficient notice, they will be able to give you an estimate of your future benefits before you retire.
