Work Smarter . . . Not Harder

MANY WOMEN work too hard with their vacuums. If you have a canister cleaner, don't push down on the nozzle. This just makes it work harder and is rougher on you. It's the suction that does the cleaning, not the push down in the carpet. Bearing down on the wand tips up the front of nozzle, breaks the vacuum seal. Then dirt can't be pulled out. Watch it next time and see if pushing down doesn't make the front end come up. Just guide the cleaner along, keep the nozzle flat, and you'll pick up more dirt.

AN ENTERPRISING Statistician has come up with this information about the average homemakers job. Every year she washes an acre of dirty dishes, launders three miles of clothes, scrubs five miles of floors, and washes one mile of glass. Tell this to anyone who doubts that you really work. But also tell them that you're a manager. The jobs you do that really count can't be fed into the statistician's computer.

THE GRASS STAIN season is here. You should remove the stain before laundering. Work full strength liquid laundry detergent into the stain. Or moisten the area and rub in granular detergent.

If stain remains, use bleach for fabrics which can take it. For non-washable fabrics sponge stain with rubbing alcohol if you are sure it's safe for the dye. Test it first on an inconspicuous area.

IF STARCH sticks to your iron, rub the cooled sole plate with a cloth sprinkled with baking soda. Spray starch may ball up or flake if you use too much. Spray lightly and have the iron at the right fabric temperature before you start.
