OFFICIAL BALLOT
for Mill City Rural Fire Protection District, Marion County, Oregon, December 2, 1963.

FIRE PREVENTION CODE
(As provided in ORS 478.910 to 478.960.)

A Code to require the owner, occupants, and persons in custody of buildings, lots, and parcels of land to remove, or remedy, fire hazards and to cut and remove brush, grass, and weeds. And to prevent the unguarded burning of trash, grass, brush, and waste without a duly issued permit.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE MILL CITY RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

Section 1. Each year between April 1 and December 31, which is designated the closed season, unless otherwise declared by the Mill City Rural Fire Protection District or its duly appointed officers, no one shall, within the boundaries of the Mill City Rural Fire Protection District, set on fire, or cause to be set on fire, any forest land, grass, grain, stubble, or other combustible material, either on his own or the property of another, without first securing a permit from the fire chief of the district or his deputy and complying with its terms.

Section 2. The fire chief or his deputy may prescribe the conditions upon which the permit is issued and which are necessary to be observed in setting the fire and preventing it from spreading so that life or property may be endangered thereby. However, if any such burning results in the escape of fire or injury to the property of another, this shall be prima facie evidence that the burning was not safe and was in violation of this section.

Section 3. This permit does not relieve permittee from liability for fire damage to the property of another.

Section 4. The fire chief or his deputy may refuse, revoke, or postpone permits when necessary to prevent damage to life or property. Any permit obtained through willful misrepresentation is invalid.

Section 5. No person shall at any time within the boundaries of the Mill City Rural Fire Protection District dispose of any building or building wreckage, by fire without having first secured a permit therefor from the fire chief of the district, or refuse to comply with any reasonable conditions of the permit or the reasonable requirements of the fire chief or his deputy as to the safeguarding of such fire from spreading.

Section 6. The fire chief of the Mill City Rural Fire Protection District or his deputy may at any reasonable time, enter all public places within the district, and upon finding any fire hazard to exist, such fire chief or his deputy, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may require the removal of the fire hazard found on the premises at such inspections.

Section 7. Violation of this Code shall be punishable as provided in ORS 478.930 and 478.990.

Section 8. If any part or parcel of this fire prevention code shall be declared illegal or unconstitutional or for any other legal reason be decreed by Court to not be enforceable, same shall not affect any other part of this Fire Prevention Code.
