**MILLIONS TO SEE
BOND FLOATS IN ROSES PARADE**



Television viewers coast-to-coast will see U. S. Savings Bonds dramatized in two spectacular floats in Pasadena's famous Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day. The City of Redondo Beach will sponsor a float on which Audie Murphy (right) America's most decorated war hero and now a top screen star, appears as the Minute Man, symbol of the U. S. Savings Bonds Program. The Redondo Chamber of Commerce is co-sponsor. At left, Supervisor Frank G. Bonelli shows an artist's drawing of Los Angeles County's floral float, "Bonds of Freedom" forty feet long and fifteen feet high. The float features a life-sized Minute Man and three giant Savings Bonds in multi-hued blooms including Hawaiian orchids. The "Bonds of Freedom" theme is a salute to the 22nd anniversary of the Bond program, and to the millions of Americans who today own nearly \$47 billion in Series E and H Bonds.

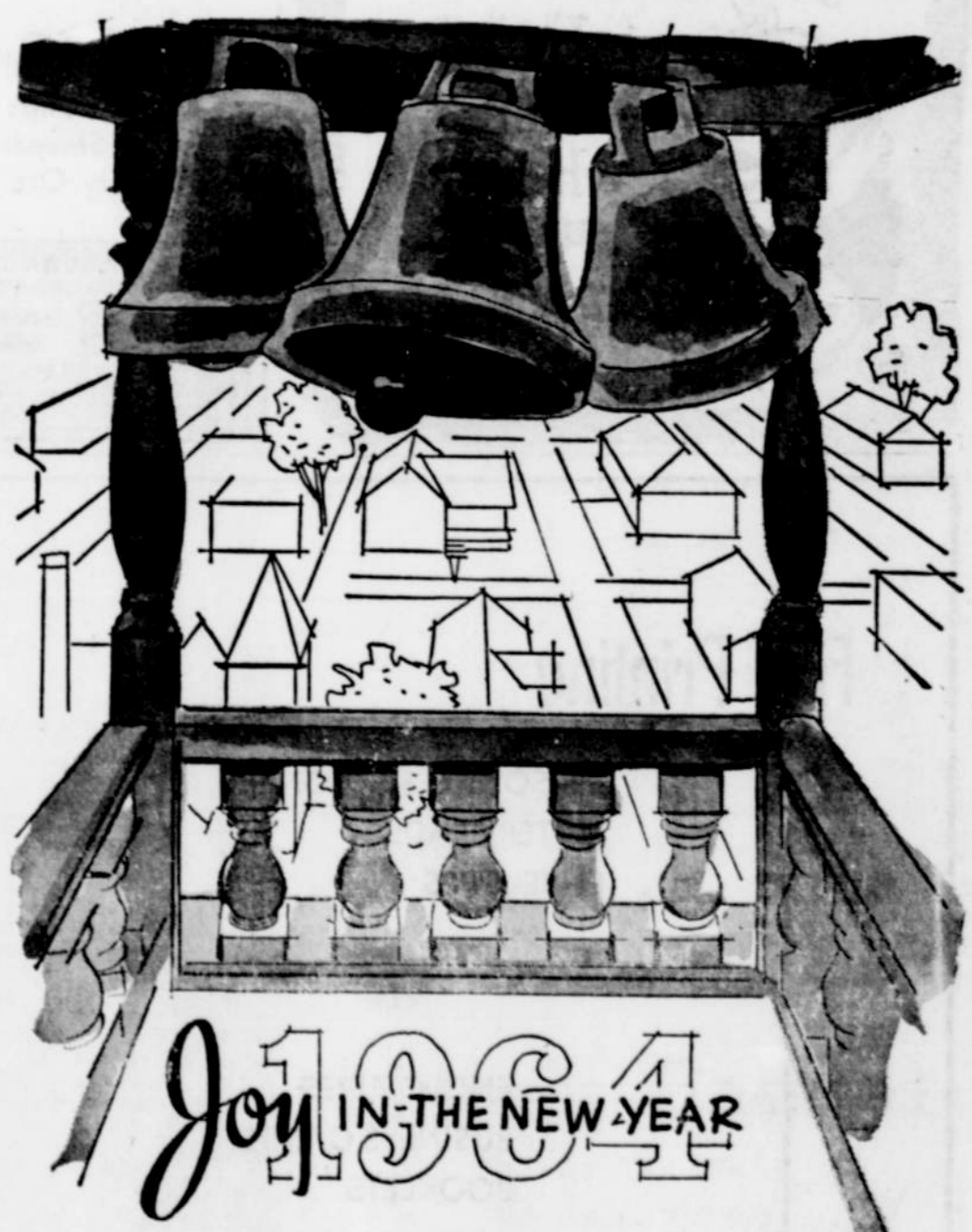
