Jim Greer, who has been in poor health for some time is now at the Marian Home at Sublimity. He is a brother of Susie Haynes.

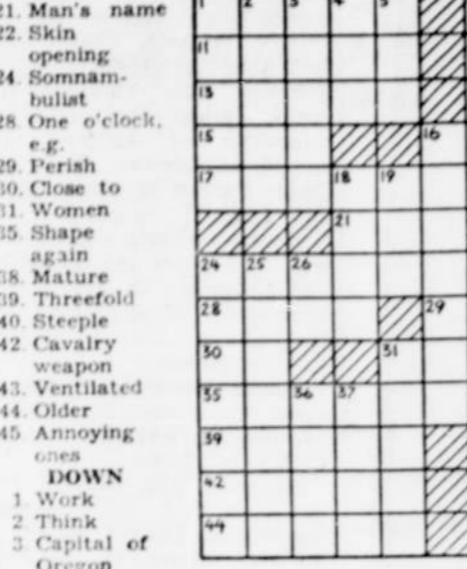
