Pallbearers were Floyd Bassett, Joe Johnson, Orville Downing, Charles Power, Otto Weidman and Leroy Goodrich.

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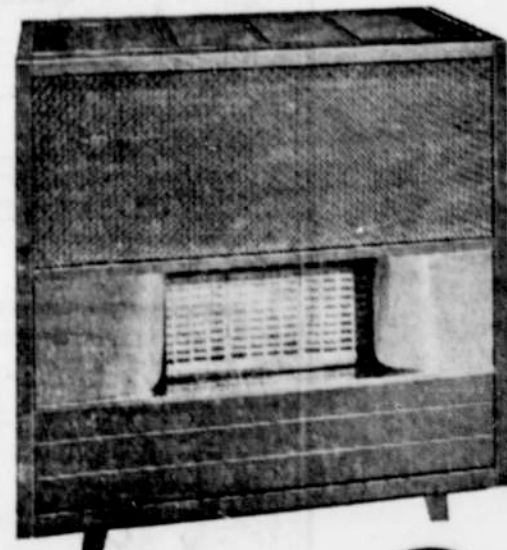
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
