Shoes made of fabric, straw, or plastic are suds-spongeable. For these, whip up dense suds in a small bowl or sink and use a sponge or soft brush to skim the "dry" suds off the top; avoid drippy water. Then use the "dry" suds to sponge the entire surface of each shoe until clean. Quickly wipe with a sponge or cloth wrung out of clear water, and then allow to dry.
