Al Pease, the “great white hunter” who lives on S. W. Spring street, gave The Enterprise a clipping taken from the Minneapolis (Minn.) Tribune about a party who shot a real weirdo deer. The picture was sent to him by his sister who lives in Wisconsin. The rare deer was shot near Effie, Minn.

The story said: “In addition to the velvet-covered 32-point antlers, the 200-pound animal had both male and female body characteristics, apparently a result of a hormonal imbalance. The doe's female hormones evidently failed, allowing male hormones to influence body development. Authorities said this irregularity was not unheard of, and might be as common as one in every 10,000 deer. The edibility of the meat is not adversely affected.”
