JESSI Program for Local High School Boys To Be In June

A one day field trip to Pacific Power & Light Company's engineering offices and computer center in Portland is in store for local high school boys who attend the annual Junior Engineers and Scientists Summer Institute this June at Oregon State University.

The Portland engineering career seminar June 21 provides opportunities to visit with PP&L engineers while on the job, and to discuss career opportunities in technical fields. The seminar is part of a two-week session at OSU which exposes the boys to college level scientific and technical studies.

The career seminar begins with morning visits to PP&L's power, design, engineering, construction and research departments, concludes with an afternoon visit to the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry and includes discussions by many of PP&L's top engineering, scientific and technical personnel.

"Inquiries about the JESSI program should be directed to the schools," stated PP&L's announcement of the seminar. The program is directed to high school sophomores and juniors.

"The purpose of the JESSI program is to expose high school boys with science and mathematics aptitudes to career possibilities in science and engineering to encourage more younger people to pursue opportunities in these fields," the announcement said.

Sandra Cooper Gets Scholarship

Sandra Cooper, senior at Santiam High school, has received word that she has been selected as a winner of one of the S & H Foundation Merchant Scholarships.

Birth Dates to Appear On All Vehicle Title Applications

Beginning April 10, birth dates will be required for all persons whose names appear on Oregon motor vehicle title applications as the registered owners.

This step is necessary, according to Vern L. Hill, director of the Department of Motor Vehicles, to provide positive identification of persons applying for titles.

DMV offices have been instructed not to process applications unless the birth date information is provided, Hill said.

"This step had to be taken," he said, "because it is difficult to avoid name mix-ups as the population grows. Birth date and full name help to reduce the possibility of error in identification."

This will also provide cross reference between driver and vehicle records, he added.
