The Santiam baseball team started league play Tuesday by defeating North Marion 2 to 1 in a tense seven-inning game. Again the old adage, "the game is never over until the last out is made," held true.

Santiam leading 2 to 1 in the last of the 7th faced the last North Marion batter with men on second and third. According to the Wolverines it took five outs and a rhabarb to retire the side.

Alan Yankus held the opposing batters to two hits, pitching himself out of trouble on two occasions when runs threatened. The lone North Marion run was earned and a single which developed into a run because of a lapse in timing and a center field bobble. Santiam hopes to iron out errors with more solid practice sessions.

On the offensive side, Santiam collected four hits. Of these four hits, Monte Lallack collected two, one a double, Craig Jones picked up a single as did Terry Hansen. Hansen's hit drove in the winning run.
