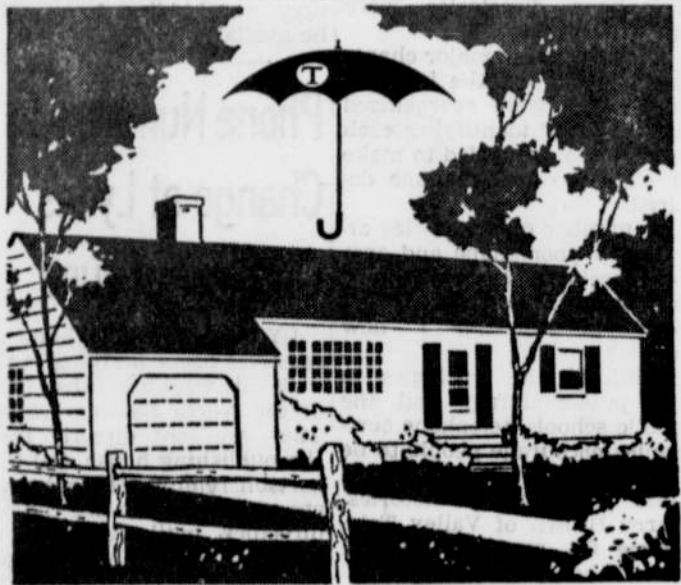

Work Smarter . . . Not Harder

Mildew on a natural wood finished wall behind a sofa was the serious concern of a recent caller to our office. She said the wall seemed to "sweat" from moisture condensation.

We suggested dipping a sponge in a solution of water and washing soda. Squeeze the water from the sponge before rubbing on the wall. Rinse with clear water, then dry thoroughly.

A fan or small electric heater may be used to hurry the drying. If water is left on the wood, it can raise the grain.

Check paint, hardware or drug stores for a mildew inhibitor which can be sprayed on wood to prevent future mildew.

The association voted to donate \$10 toward the Canyon Scholarship fund.

Mrs. James Murray read a letter of thanks from her friend Vera Lee for the tea towels sent to the mission at Embudo, also telling of her arrival in India where the young missionary is in charge of 18 young men and describing the deplorable conditions of many starving people in Calcutta, Bombay, and Madras.

A feature of the evening was a "layette shower," the items to be sent overseas. Mrs. Roy Epperson announced that a clothing drive will be held the first two weeks in May and members and friends are asked to bring articles for this worthy cause.

Treasurer's report was given by Mrs. Arlo Tuers, who was also refreshment hostess for the small group of women present.

During the course of the evening, President Martin Hansen, and Secretary Fred Berg of the Lions club made an official visit for the discussion of the price and guarantee on Lions club dinners served by the women each Monday night. The decision will be given later.

Along with the showing of her slides, Mrs. Crouch told in detail of the years she and her husband, who is assistant pastor at the First Presbyterian church in Salem, spent as missionaries in Thailand. She stated that many lay men are being sent overseas, including nurses, teachers, etc., as well as pastors. These are called "fraternal workers," and are paid by the Presbyterian church. There are already many established churches in various countries, made up of several denominations combined. Missionaries, who formerly were expected to be in control of the situation, are now training natives to take over the work. Mrs. Crouch is now a teacher at Hillcrest School for Girls.

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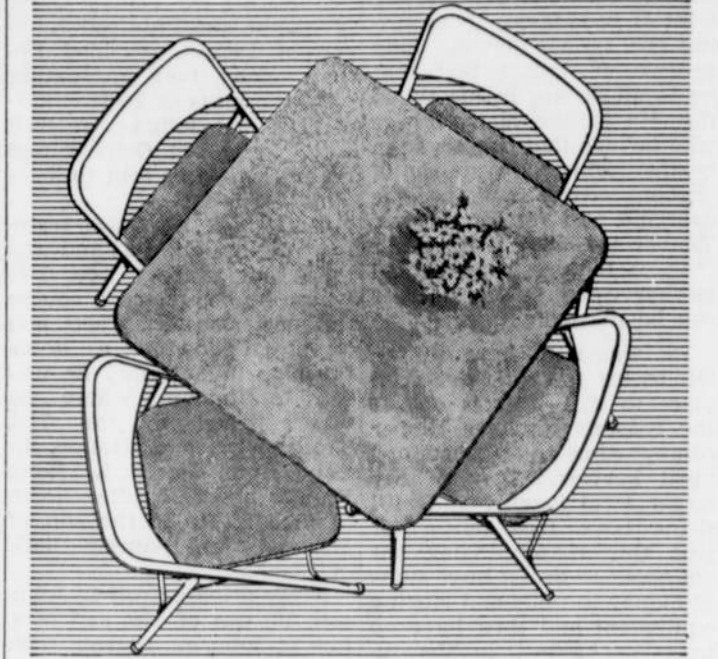
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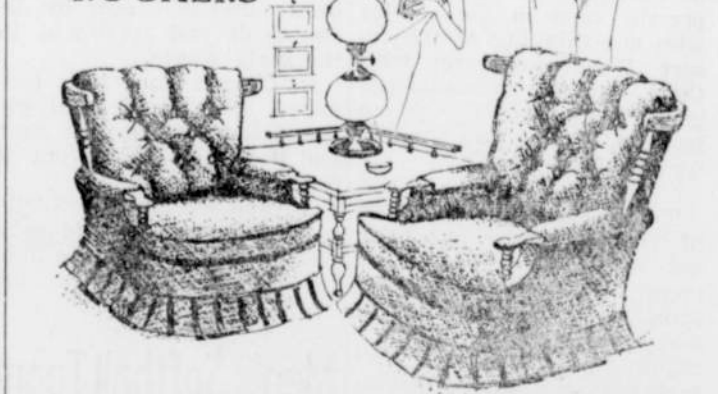
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
