## Water Supply Looks Favorable

Farmers and other water users in the Willamette Valley can expect nearly adequate water supplies this summer, according to a report released today by A. J. Webber, State Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service, Portland, and prepared by W. T. Frost, State Snow Survey Supervisor, representing cooperative federal, state, and private agencies. There will be only a fair supply on lower elevation streams.

Snow covers remain only at the higher elevations but is more extensive than usual for June conditions due to frequent cold periods.

Moisture in the soil mantle on upper watersheds has continued to increase from snowmelt and is currently much better than average.

The Willamette Valley multiple purpose reservoirs are all storing close to average June 1 amounts.

## Opening of Spillway Gates to Mark Dedication of Green Peter and Foster Dams on Saturday, June 24th

Opening of the spillway gates of Foster Dam in Linn County on Saturday June 24 will mark the formal dedication of Green Peter and Foster Dams — newest units in the Portland U. S. Army Engineer District's Willamette Basin flood control program.

A. Warren Jones, Executive Secretary of the Willamette Basin Committee and coordinator of dedication ceremonies, has announced that Oregon's Governor Tom McCall and senior United States Senator Wayne Morse, and Major General Frederick J. Clarke, Deputy Chief of Army Engineers will speak at the event.

The three principals will each flip switches simultaneously to open the spillway gates of the dam, permitting water to run through, and symbolically placing the combined \$82,300,000 Green Peter

and Foster Dams project in operation.

Jones also said that Oregon's Congressman Al Ullman of the Second Congressional District would be master of ceremonies at the dedication which will start at 2:30 p. m.

The public is invited to attend the dedication which is being sponsored by the Linn County Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the Willamette Basin Project Committee. Jones has asked persons planning to attend the event to bring their own folding chairs.

Green Peter and Foster Dams are located on the Middle and South Santiam Rivers near Foster about 38 and 31 miles southeast of Albany. They are nearing completion by the Portland U. S. Army Engineer District Jerry Schunk.
