Miss Carol Ragsdale returned to her home Thursday from Monmouth where she attended OCE.

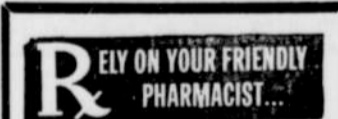

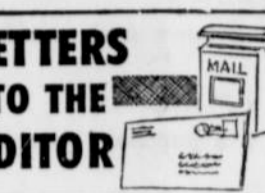

 In April of this year, Clark, and a classmate, Pfc. Cecil Johnson met in a mess hall by chance. Since that time both boys have been on the lookout for Dennis, and a friend, Earnest Presely, also of Idanha.
 Spencer entered the service last September and took advanced training at Fort Benjamin, finance school, Harrison, Indiana. He went overseas in April and is with the U. S. Army Engineering Command at Biem-Hoa, Vietnam.
 Clark went overseas in February and is with the 71st Transportation Battalion at Long Binh, Vietnam. He took his base training at Fort Polk, La., and was sent to Fort Lee, Va., where he completed a course in quartermaster's parts and supply.

Pfc. Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lex Johnson of Detroit, took basic training at Ft. Lewis, Washington and was then sent to Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., where he completed a course in Combat Engineering.
