Pvt. Robert McCall Completes Marine Training at San Diego

SAN DIEGO, CALIF., June 29—Marine Private Robert L. McCall, son of Mr. William D. McCall of Mill City, Ore., was graduated from eight weeks of recruit training at the Ma-rine Corps Recruit Depot here.

He will now undergo about three weeks of individual combat training and then, af-ter leave at home, will report to his first Marine Corps as-signment.

The intensified Marine re-cruit training emphasizes rigid physical conditioning and survival techniques, both at sea and ashore, to develop self-confidence and endurance. Marksmanship with M-14 rifle and 45-calibre pistol are equally stressed, and close or-der drill instills the traditions of Marine Corps teamwork.

A thorough study of basic military subjects; hygiene; first aid and sanitation; and the customs, courtesies, his-tory and mission of the Ma-rine Corps serve to polish the new Marine's recruit educa-tion and prepare him to join Marine Combat forces.
