Oregon To Have Driving Course

Oregon's shocking increase in traffic deaths and accidents has prompted the State Department of Education to provide this fall a televised course in sportsmanlike driving.

During a 15-week period beginning September 25, both students and adults will be able to view 30 programs which include everything from basic hand and foot coordination to the economic significance of being a good driver. The series will be aired during both daytime and evening hours.

"The alarming number of highway deaths in our state over the past Fourth of July weekend deeply disturbs me," said Superintendent of Public Instruction Leon Meier. "Perhaps this televised course will not only help our young people learn how to think behind the wheel, but will help all those on the road become defensive drivers."

Driver education teachers will use the series to supplement their classroom work. The television lessons are designed to be used with a

standard textbook which is used in most Oregon schools.

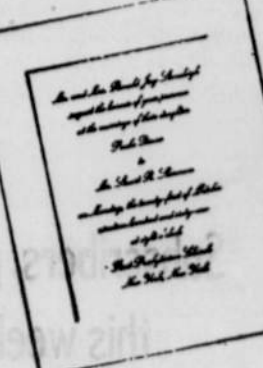

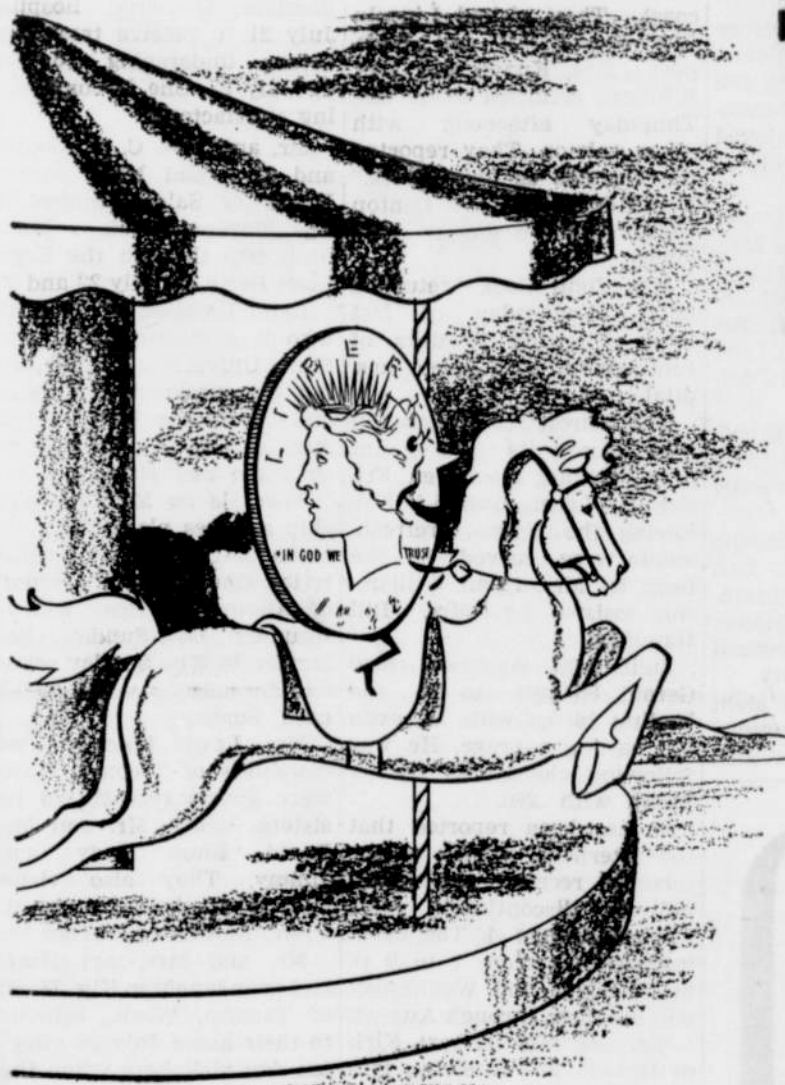
