The J. C. Kimmels just completed a 37-day Trailways "Green Carpet" New England Tour, starting from Portland and traveling through seven Provinces of Canada, 19 States and the District of Columbia.

Highlights along the way were the Expo '67, Niagara Falls, and beautiful Queen Victoria Park; Quebec City, the only walled city north of Mexico, with its very French atmosphere, horse drawn carriages, cobblestone streets, and a two-night stay at the famous Chateau Frontenac; the Gaspé Peninsula which follows the St. Lawrence Seaway to the Atlantic ocean, with its small French fishing villages; the New England states with their fall color, which they were told was not as vivid as usual, because no frost had touched that part of the east; Portland, Maine with its historical background; Boston with its interesting sights along the "Old Freedom Trail;" New York City's hugeness kept the tour busy for three days; Williamsburg with all its 18th Century historical events and places, Plymouth, Gettysburg, Washington, D. They visited a session of the Senate with Robert Kennedy and Everett Dirksen's deep booming voice; Mt. Vernon and a visit to the home of George Washington and grounds; Chicago brought the Kimmels a visit from John (Brick) Swan and his wife, Helen. The states of Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, South Dakota and Montana were beautiful with fall color.

This wonderful trip came to an end in Portland after covering 8,865 accident-free miles and meeting 35 new friends from Oregon, Washington, California, Arizona, Idaho and Hawaii.
