Bonafide Farms Get Different Assessment

Marion County Assessor H. F. Domogalla reports that applications are being received from owners of unzoned bona fide farms under legislation enacted last year redefining farm use value and providing for a different method of appraising for assessment and taxation of qualifying farms.

Farm use value applies to two categories, the assessor explained. One is land located in a farm use zone, as established by the County Court or Board of County Commissioners in accordance with state law, and currently devoted to farm use.

The other category includes bona fide farms devoted to farm use and specially assessed as a result of the owner's annual application for farm use assessment, which must be filed by March 31 each year.

Market (true cash) value for highest and best use will apply to all other farmland, the assessor emphasizes. In the case of land in a farm use zone, no application is needed. The assessor is required to appraise all land devoted to farm use in a zoned area at farm use value. In this group there are no deferred taxes due at some later date.

An owner of an unzoned bona fide farm who wants it assessed at farm use value with a portion of the tax deferred until the land use changes may file an application with the county assessor. The application must be made on a form supplied by the assessor and available only at his office.

If the land has been subject to special assessment in the preceding year, a late filing may be made up to and including April 30 by paying a \$10 late filing fee. In such cases, the assessor will notify the land owner by April 10 that a filing has not been made.

Assessor H. F. Domogalla lists the following requirements for farm use assessments (deferral):

1. The land is currently being used exclusively as a bona fide farm.
 2. The land has been used exclusively as a bona fide farm for the two years immediately preceding the year of application.
 3. The gross income for each of three of the five calendar years immediately preceding the year of application has been \$500 or more.
 4. There are no outstanding leases or options to buy the surface rights of the land for other than farm use.
- If an application is approved, the farmland will be assessed at farm use value to be determined as follows:
1. The net income (after property taxes) from the land based on typical rents in the area will be determined.
 2. This net income will be divided by the capitalization

3. The result will be the value of the land for farm use.

The assessor explains that whenever the use of the land changes, or otherwise becomes disqualified for farm use assessment, the deferred taxes plus interest for the last five or lesser number of years in which the farm use assessment was in effect will be added to the tax extended against the land on the next general property tax roll.

Interest of 6 percent, from the dates at which such additional taxes would have been payable if no special assessment had been in effect, will be included in the amount of deferral to be collected.
