**DETROIT**—Three members of a Bend family were hospitalized late Sunday night when their car crashed into the rear end of a stalled lumber truck on the North Santiam Highway about 11 miles East of Detroit. Listed in serious condition Monday at Salem Memorial hospital is Don D. Callahan, 32, who suffered a board embedment (1x4) in the chest, and a large cut on the forehead. His wife, Carole, 28, was listed in good condition with facial injuries. At Salem General hospital their daughter, Kelly Jean, 7, was listed in fair condition with internal injuries, and Amy Lynn, 4, was given out patient treatment.

The truck stopped along the road and was owned and operated by Forest O. Garrigus, 37, Bend. Three dogs in the Callahan car were not injured. Garrigus was charged with failure to display lights on a disabled vehicle, police said.

The Callahan's were taken to the Salem hospital by Detroit Mobile First Aid Unit following the 11:00 P. M. accident. The children who did not appear to be injured at Hoffman in Salem were return-grandparents home in Salem by some college students, and were not taken to the hospital until Monday morning when Kelly Jean complained of stomach pains.

The Callahan's who had been visiting the grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence the time were taken to their home when the accident occurred. Mr. Callahan is employed by the U. S. Forest Service at Bend.
