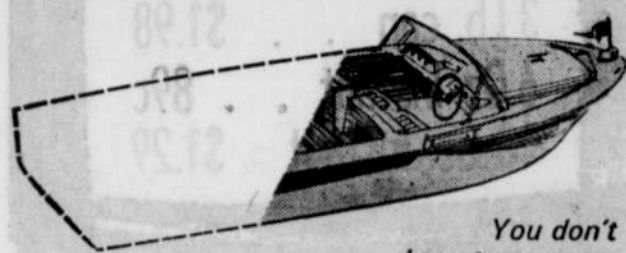

CUT UPKEEP COSTS OF PLUMBING by preventive measures such as these.

Leaky faucets usually need a new washer. A faucet leaking 60 drops a minute will waste 2,300 gallons of water in a year. Use a rubber plunger to clear obstructions beyond drain traps. This should be tried before using chemicals to clear a drain.

Keep foreign objects out of drains. Never pour grease down drains. Always run cold water, not hot, while using the waste disposer and for 30 seconds afterwards.

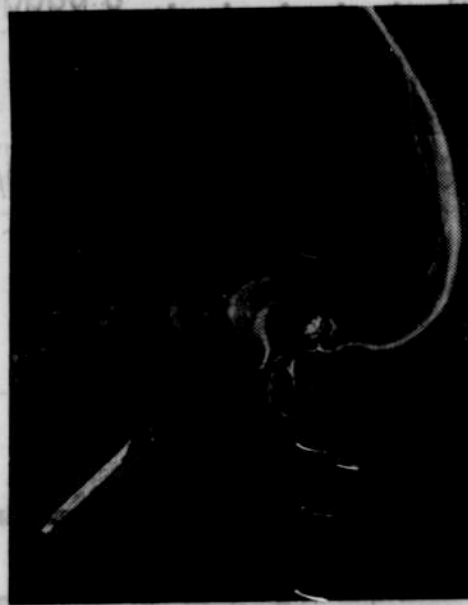

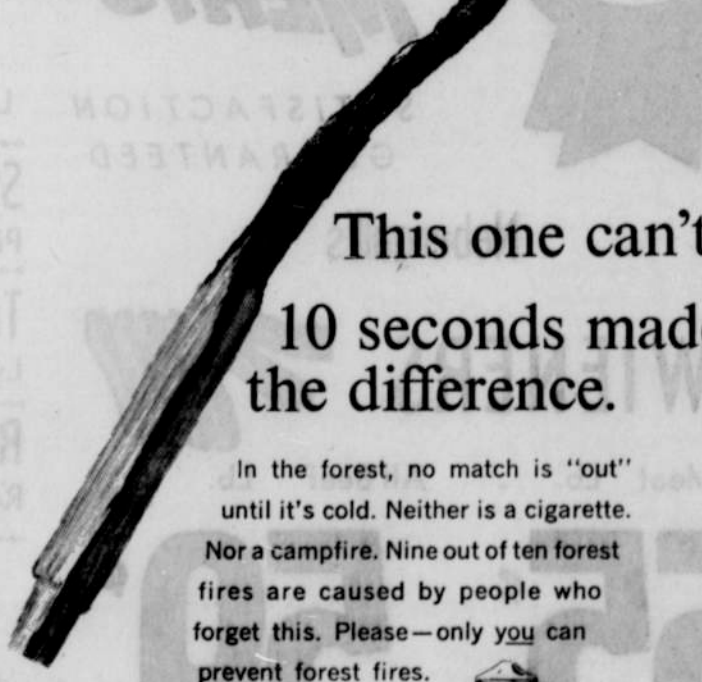
