## Oregon Gun Laws Affect Hunters Says Commission

Oregon hunters are advised that gun laws in the Oregon Statutes dealing with criminal use, misuse, or negligent use of rifles, shotguns, and pistols apply to them as well as to any other person.

This is the advice of the Game Commission following receipt of many inquiries from Oregon citizens asking for information on both federal and state firearm laws.

Two Oregon laws which deal with the reckless or careless killing or injury to another person are of particular concern to hunters. ORS 166-300 reads in part: "Any person who has committed, with firearms of any description, murder in any degree, or manslaughter, either voluntary or involuntary, or who in a careless or reckless manner kills or injures another with firearms, and who, at any time after committing murder or manslaughter or after said careless or reckless killing or injury carries or bears arms of any description within this state shall be punished upon conviction by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one year, or both."

ORS 166.310 also deals with negligently wounding another. This law reads: "Any person who as a result of his failure to use ordinary care under the circumstances, wounds any other person with a bullet or shot from any firearm or with an arrow from any bow, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not to exceed six months, or by a fine of not to exceed \$500, or both. In addition, any person so convicted shall forfeit any license to hunt, obtained under the laws of this state, and shall be ineligible to obtain a license to hunt for a period of 10 years following the date of his conviction."

The Game Commission does not maintain records on the misuse of firearms or of firearm casualties other than those associated with hunting. Accurate records are kept on hunting accidents with firearms on a calendar year basis showing deaths, woundings, given causes, and individuals involved.

In the past eleven years hunter casualties with firearms have ranged from a low of 62 to a high of 94, with fatalities during this period ranging from 12 to 15 per year. Roughly one-third to one-half of the casualties, including deaths, are self-inflicted. This leaves some accidents which might fall within the "reckless or careless" category.

In answer to another often-asked question, Oregon citizens, in effect already regis-

ter handguns. ORS 166.420 requires that, except for normal shipment between wholesalers and retailers, "every person in the business of selling, leasing, or otherwise transferring a pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person... shall keep a register in which shall be entered the time, date and place of sale, the name of the salesman making the sale, the make, model, manufacturer's number, caliber or other mark of identification on the pistol, revolver or other firearm."

"The purchaser of any firearm capable of being concealed upon the person shall sign, and the dealer shall require him to sign, his address to the register in duplicate and the salesman shall affix his signature in duplicate as a witness to the signature of the purchaser."

This law also requires the dealer on the same day of sale to mail a duplicate of the registration form to the city or county police or in a rural area to the county clerk. The law also stipulates that no pistol or revolver shall be delivered on the day of the application for purchase unless the buyer is personally known to the seller or presents clear evidence of his identity.

ORS 166.240 and ORS 166.250 deal with carrying concealed firearms and certain other concealable weapons, illegal in Oregon except by license to do so. These two laws cover concealed weapons on the person as well as in vehicles. Exception is made for law enforcement officers, servicemen when on duty, members of certain organizations under certain conditions, and licensed hunters and fishermen while hunting and fishing or going to or from. Persons under 18, convicts, and aliens are prohibited from possessing handguns in Oregon.

Several other statutes deal

with the possession of firearms by felons and criminals and of the criminal misuse of firearms. According to these statutes, stiff penalties are required on conviction for criminal misuse of firearms, in addition to the penalty for any other crime which might be committed.

In addition to the Oregon Statutes, there are numerous city ordinances regulating the use of firearms. Individuals should check with their city commissioners, city officials,

or city police departments for local regulations.

Copies of the federal firearms laws, much too lengthy and involved to include here, may be obtained from the U. S. Treasury Department, Washington, D. C. 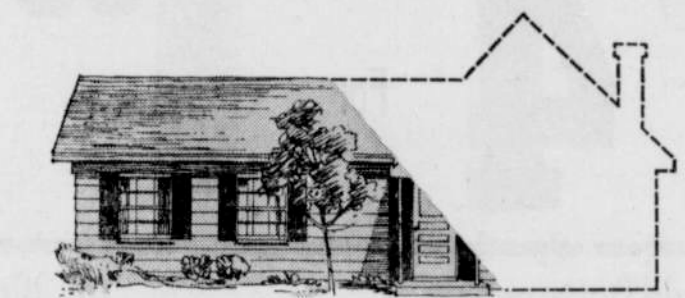
