NOTICE OF SALE OF IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 8 p.m. on the 11th day of December, 1968, and immediately thereafter will be publicly opened by the Council of the City of Mill City, Oregon, for the purchase at not less than par and accrued interest of \$11,000 of Sewer Improvement Bonds of such city dated November 1, 1968, in denominations of \$1,000 each, and maturing in instalments of \$1,000 each on November 1 of each of the years 1970 to 1980 inclusive, with the right reserved to the city to redeem in regular numerical order at par and accrued interest on November 1, 1969 and on any interest day thereafter any or all of the bonds of the issue.

The bonds will bear interest payable semi-annually at such rate or rates, not more than two, in multiples of one-fourth (1/4) of one percent per annum not exceeding six (6) percent per annum, as shall be specified by the successful bidder. Each bond shall have but one coupon for the interest due on any interest date. Both the principal of and the interest on the bonds will be paid at the

office of the Treasurer of Mill City, Oregon.

The bonds are the general obligations of Mill City, Oregon, and will be paid from collections of assessments already levied against real properties within such City specially benefited by a public sanitary sewer system constructed in the business area of such city, in accordance with Sections 223.205 to 223.300, Oregon Revised Statutes and Chapter IX of the Charter and Ordinance No. 50 of such city.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified or cashiers check in favor of such City, or on a bank doing business in Oregon, in the sum of \$1,000, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked "PROPOSAL FOR BONDS."

The check of the successful bidder will be retained as part payment for the bonds or to secure such city against any loss that may result from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid.

The successful bidder will be furnished without cost with the written opinion of Shuler, Rankin, Myers & Walsh, bond attorneys of Portland, Oregon to the effect that the bonds are the valid and legally binding obligations of Mill City, Oregon, and are exempt from taxation under present federal income tax laws.

The bonds will be delivered complete without undue delay at the expense of the city at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name.

The City of Mill City, Oregon has no present indebtedness.
