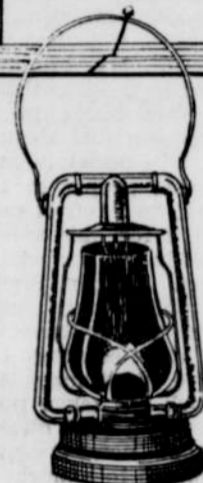
Carol Ragsdale Honored at Party

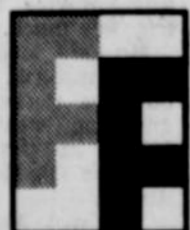
