The Oregon State Tax Commission reports that graduate foresters are being sought for positions at Roseburg to assist in the administration of Oregon's timber tax laws. Acceptable applicants will be offered positions immediately. The Commission said, at an annual starting salary of approximately \$7,200. Increases can be earned to a maximum of \$10,104. Applicants must be graduate foresters, physically qualified, with practical experience in timber cruising, as the Commission jobs involve field work inventorying of private timber. 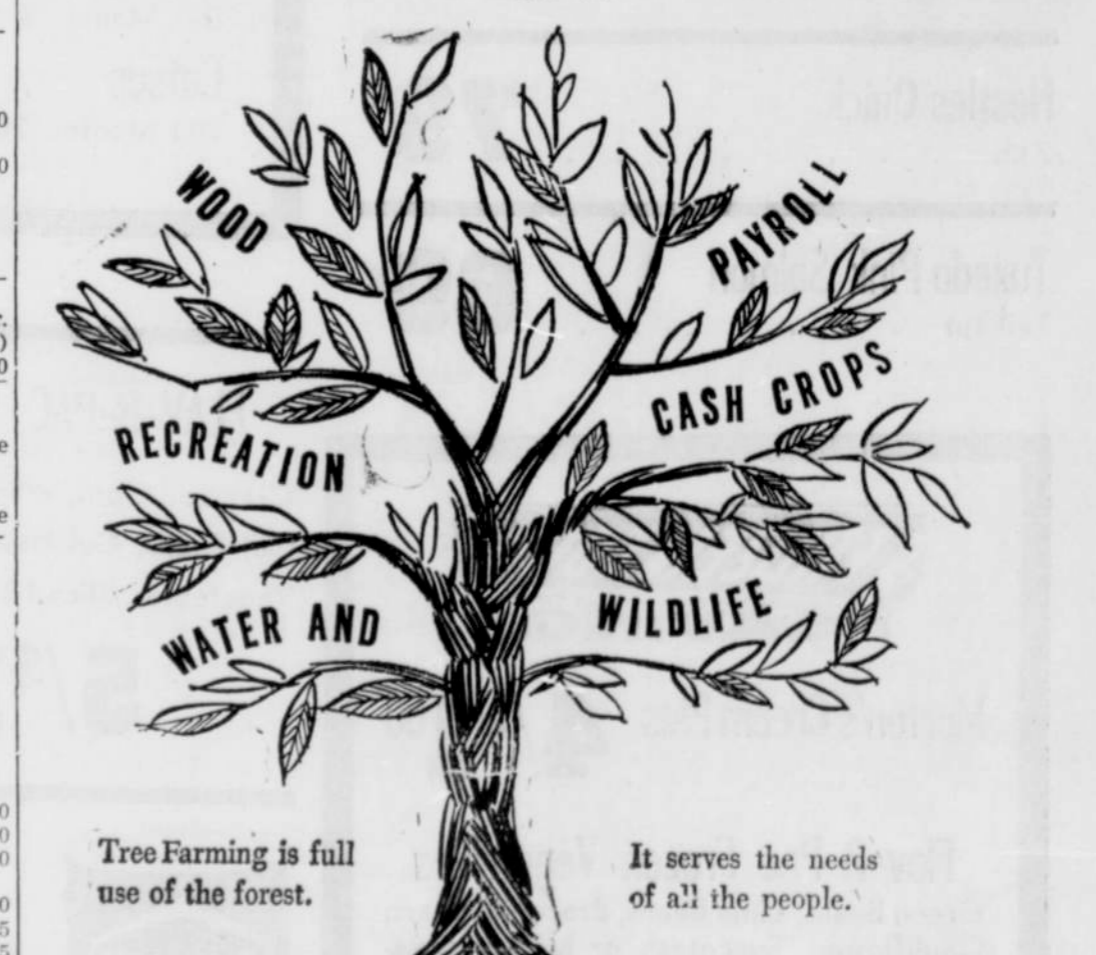
