Weafrier Summary For May 1969 In Upper Canyon

DETROIT—Month of May average was about five degrees warmer than the 25 year average.

The highest reading was 88 degrees on the 12th. The lowest reading was 31 degrees on the 4th.

May record high is 95 degrees, in 1958 and 1963, record low is 25 degrees in 1954.

May's precipitation of 3.58 was only a fourth inch less than the 25 year average. Greatest 24 hour rainfall for the month was .83 inches on the 30th.

Record for May precipitation is 8.77 inches in 1960; the record for a 24 hour period is 2.73 inches, on May 2, 1949.

Only a trace of snow fell in Detroit on the 4th, which is normal for the month. The record however is 4.0 inches on the 15th in 1959.
