## School Enrollment Survey To Be Held

by interviews of the Bureau of the Census during the week of October 19, according to John E. Tharaldson, Director of the Bureau's regional office in Seattle.

Local interviewing will be part of a nationwide effort made annually to measure the Nation's school and college population. A similar survey in October 1968 showed total enrollment to be 58.8 million persons-33.8 million in elementary school, 14.1 million in secondary school, 3.3 million in kindergarten, 816,000 in nurserv school, and 6.8 million in

The survey will be made along with the monthly national survey of employment and unemployment for the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor which furnishes a basic measure of national economic health.

Information collected in Census Bureau surveys can be used only to determine statistical totals, and facts about each person and family are kept

confidential by law. Interviewer who will visit households in this area is Mrs. Patricia Baker of Salem.
