## Ralph Thompson Working on Space Program for Brazilian Government

Archie Thompson brought an item to the Enterprise last week taken from the Herald News (front page, no less!) in Livermore, Dublin and Pleasanton California about their son Ralph Thompson.

Mr. and Mrs. Thompson said their son worked his way through school almost entirely on his own. He worked for Cedar Lumber company and Wills Shingle Mills during the summer. His "buddy" in Mill City was Jerry Johnson.

He attended Oregon State University where he received his BA degree then after working two years he came back for two more years of study on a fellowship. The article from the California paper is being re-printed for the interest it should be to Ralph's friends here.

LIVERMORE — Sandia Laboratories engineer Ralph Thompson recently took a three week leave of absence from his job at the Livermore research center to assist the Brazilian government in launching two "Aerobee" rockets over 130 miles into the atmosphere.

But Thompson's interest in the impoverished nation's fledgling "space program" began long before the dramatic launch itself.

In 1968 Thompson was part of a group of engineers and scientists doing astrophysical research under a joint arrangement between the University of California's Space Science Laboratory and the Brazilian government. The object of their complex, layman-baffling study was to obtain data on some 30 stars known to emit X-rays in the J-100 kilo electron volt range.

"My job was to design the 260-pound rocket payloads containing the X-ray counters," he stated. "Those counters fit between the nose cone and the liquid fuel rocket."

Why go to South American to conduct the tests?

"The launch site was at Natal — 300 miles below the equator — on the eastern tip of Brazil," he explained. At this location, instruments in the freely-spinning rocket could scan the southern sky to discover new X-ray emitting stars, and they could also measure X-rays from stars previously observed in the Northern Hemisphere.

For several months in 1968 the Sandian worked and lived in Sao Jose Dos Campos, a city of 60,000 about 60 miles north of Sao Paulo.

## New Wilderness Area Maps Are Available Now

The U. S. Forest Service has just published a new map brochure for the 196,708 acre Three Sisters Wilderness in the Deschutes and Willamette National Forests.

It replaces a brochure printed in 1964.

The new brochure differs in that the map for the huge Wilderness is topographic; that is, it has contour lines to indicate elevations.

Only one trail log is provided: this is for the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail. All other mileages can be obtained from the map itself; distances are printed between marked points, much as on a highway map.

The new brochure contains information on geology of the Three Sisters Wilderness, as well as on mountain climbing, exploring, and fishing and hunting.

The brochure is available without cost at any office of the Willamette National Forest.

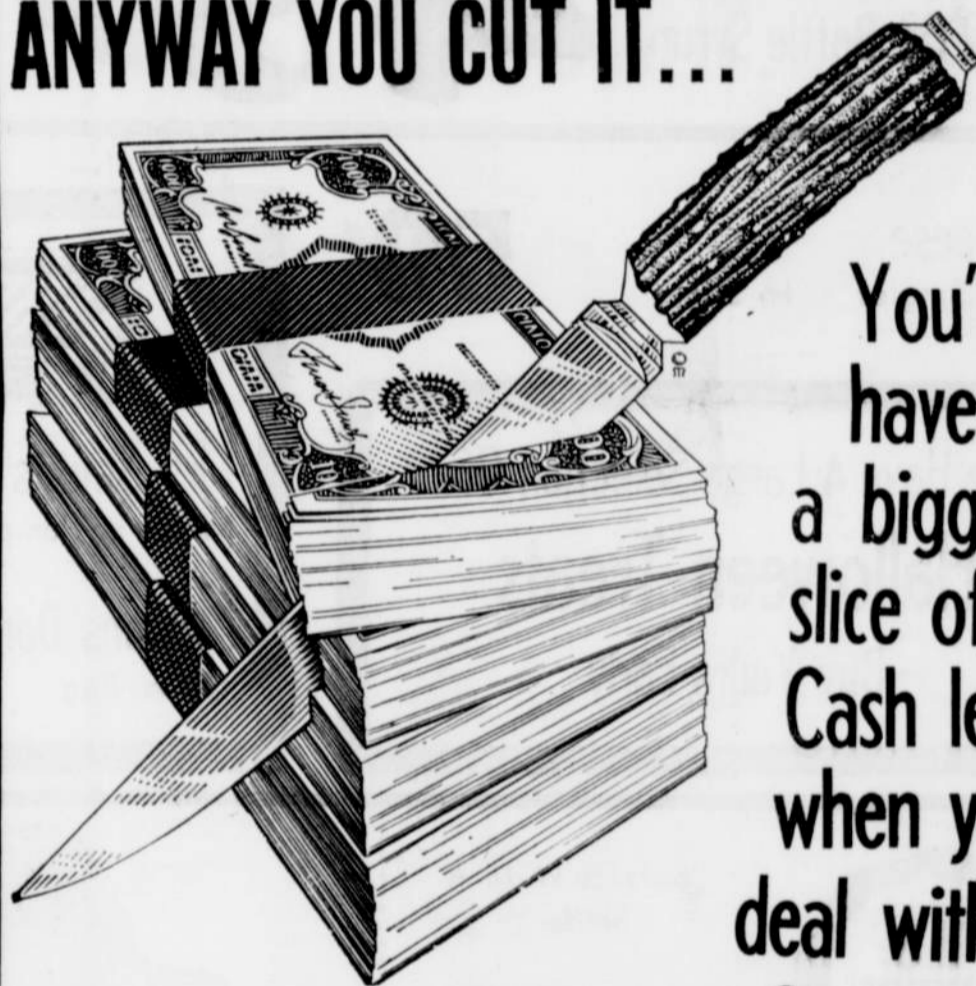
