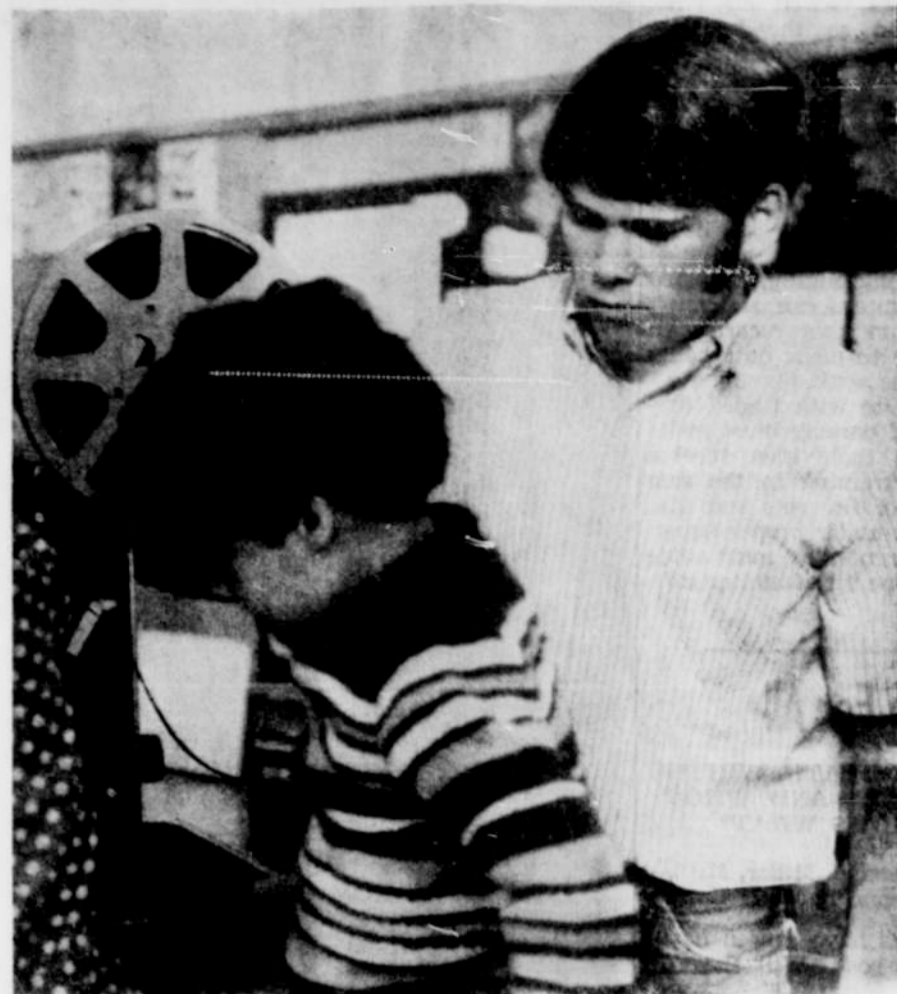

Santiam High Initiates Cadet Teaching Program

These are just a few remarks Gates primary students made last week to the three seniors, Greg Davis, Louise Gruver, and Janice Lewellen who are assisting Mrs. Barnhardt, Mrs. Stenbeck, Mrs. Phelps, and Mrs. Parker. They spend the first two periods of the day working in the classroom with these teachers, helping with equipment and materials, and tutoring students needing individual instruction. These three seniors are classified as "cadet teachers" and in addition to their work in the classroom are required to do some reading in educational publications, make reports, and evaluate their activities. They must be members of Future Teachers of America, an organization whose main purpose is to explore teaching as a profession. Mrs. Sheythe, who is adviser of F.T.A. set up some of the guide lines for the "cadet" program and helps them evaluate their activities. All three "cadets" agree that helping kids is a rewarding experience. "It's fun. They do cute things. I wish there had been someone to help me in the lower grades" are some of their comments.  
 The primary students themselves are enthusiastic and appreciative of this special attention. They will work hard to gain approval. Mrs. Barnhardt says the masculine influence adds to the learning experiences of both boys and girls who thought it was great to surprise Greg with the birthday book last week. First grade teacher Marge Parker comments that the "cadet teachers" seem like part of the staff and have been especially helpful when substitute teachers have been necessary. All of the teachers involved in the program agree that these students are doing a good job. Although a student teachers' aid program has been in effect for four years in the district, this is the first time that the Gates Primary School has been included, and the first time for "cadet teachers". With the continued success of the program, it is hoped that more students will be interested next year.
