**Christmas Stamps Being Issued Again**

For the eighth consecutive year, the U. S. Post Office Dept. is issuing a Christmas stamp. Christmas Seals, issued concurrently, are now in their 63rd year.

The 1969 Christmas stamp design is from a painting, "Winter Sunday in Norway, Maine," by an unknown artist. The artist who adapted the painting for the stamp, Stevan Dohanos, also designed the 1941 Christmas Seal. Dohanos is a member of the Postmaster General's Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee.

Bernice Kochan, the artist for this year's Christmas Seal, designed two recent commemorative postage stamps: The Alabama statehood stamp, and the stamp honoring the legendary jazz musician W. C. Handy. The 1969 Christmas Seal is a four-part seal showing children dancing around a Christmas tree.

The 1969 Christmas stamp was issued November 3 in Christmas, Florida. It is now available at local post offices.

Christmas Seals are being sent out by local affiliates of the National Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association throughout the United States during November. Wilamette Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association, 1890 State Street, Salem, Oregon, is the local affiliate for Benton, Linn, Marion, Polk and Yamhill counties. Contributions to the Christmas Seal campaign provide funds to fight emphysema, tuberculosis and air pollution.
