Santiam High Girl Receives Scholarship

Linda Crowther of Mill City has won a one-year, full-tuition scholarship to the newly-named Chemeketa Community College for being selected as the semi-finalist from Santiam High School in the "Name the Community College" Contest.

The winning name "Chemeketa Community College", formerly Salem Technical Vocational Community College, was selected Wednesday evening (December 3) by the Board of Directors of the Mid-Willamette Area Education District.

Susan Blum of Salem, a student in the dental assisting program at the college, submitted the winning name. She will receive a two-year, full-tuition scholarship to the college.

In the 50-word theme, required with each semi-final entry, Miss Blum said she chose Chemeketa because "long before the white man came to this area, all of the Willamette Valley Indians gathered at a place called Chemeketa (today called Salem) to conduct councils."

"They came in peace to make and renew friendships, to share old ideas and cultivate new ones."

Each of the district's 29 private and public high schools was eligible to submit one semi-finalist in the contest. Twenty-one high schools participated. A semi-finalist also was submitted from the college. Each semi-finalist received a one-year scholarship.

From the semi-finalists submitted by the high schools, an instructor-board-student committee selected six finalists which were submitted to board members for the final college name selection.

The seven-member board was unaware of the origin of the finalists until its vote on the new name was taken.
